**C**hildren and  
**H**oosiers  
**I**mmunization  
**R**egistry  
**P**rogram



## About CHIRP

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- Statewide Immunization Registry provided by the Indiana State Department of Health
- FREE to providers
- Internet Based Application
  - (no software to download)
- Secure and Confidential
- Opt-Out Registry



## Benefits to Providers

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- Helps to reduce under and over immunization of patients
- Improves immunization rates by providing a more complete and current immunization history
- Contains Indiana State Department of Health Lead screening test results



## Benefits to Providers (cont.)

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- Provides Lead screening prompts for children under 7 years of age to CHIRP users
- Reduces staff time spent searching and calling for immunization records
- Simplifies vaccine management by tracking inventory and automatically creating the Vaccines for Children (VFC) reporting document
  - No more faxing the VFC bubble sheet

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- Creates reminder/recall notifications for parents and patients
  - Postage-paid cards are available at no charge from ISDH
- Prints Official Immunization Cards
  - The blue immunization cards are available from ISDH at no charge
- Exports records to use in Clinical Assessment Software Application (CASA) to check your immunization coverage rates

**Every Fall: Flu Vaccine**  
- All children 6 months to 5 years of age  
- All children 6 months and older with asthma, diabetes, or other chronic health conditions.  
- Others in the household of a 5-year old child.  
See children 6 months through 5 years old over 2 times, one each year, in their first year of life.

**Before Kindergarten:**  
DTaP, Polio, Hib, HepB, and HepA are already given. MMR and Varicella.  
Indiana's "20-18-02" Childhood Immunization Schedule is compatible with the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) of the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), and the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP). ## Enrollment Process

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- Full Access or View Access
  - Contact CHIRP Recruiter/CHIRP Support Center
  - 3 forms to complete and FAX
  - Set up onsite training date
  - Staff is trained and ready to use CHIRP
- For VIEW ONLY
  - Watch Training Video (approx. 8 minutes)
  - CD or on the Web



## Enrollment Forms

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- **Provider Site Enrollment Agreement**
  - Make sure it is signed
- **Individual User Agreement**
  - Specify Full or View Access
  - Specify Inventory/Lot Access
- **Confidentiality Agreement**
  - Specify Temporary Password
  - Personal Email address (if available)
